Registration, Transfer, Refund, and Cancellation Terms

Touchstone makes every effort to run each scheduled workshop. However, the organization reserves the right to cancel a workshop for any reason. Touchstone will make cancellation notifications at least 14 days ahead of the start of the workshop. If a workshop cancellation occurs, students will be able to (1) transfer to another workshop or (2) receive a full refund less the nonrefundable COVID-19 fee.

Processing Fees: This required fee helps cover the operational costs associated with processing registration materials. This \$15 fee will be applied to registrations for all Community Wood Firings, 1-day, 2-day, 3-day, and 5-day workshops.

Returned Check Fee: A returned check fee payable to Touchstone for insufficient funds is \$25. This fee will be billed upon notice from the bank and the student shall be required to submit payment for this along with the original deposit/balance in order to be guaranteed participation in the workshop.

Balances: Please remember, remaining balances are due 30 days prior to the start of the workshop. If any unpaid balance remains after the final payment due date, you will not be guaranteed participation in the workshop.

Transfers: Contact the office as soon as possible if you wish to transfer to a different workshop. A transfer fee of \$20 (per transfer) will be added to your final invoice. Transfers must be processed more than 30 days prior to the workshop start date for your original workshop; transfers are not permitted at or less than 30 days prior to the workshop start date and all balances will be due in full.

Nonrefundable COVID-19 Fee: A \$10 (1- & 2-day workshops), \$15 (3-day workshops), and \$20 (5-day workshops) COVID-19 fee will be charged per participant, per workshop during the 2021 season to help offset the extraordinary additional and increased expenses to Touchstone for cleaning, sanitizing, PPE, disposables, and other costs directly related to ensuring health, safety, and social distancing requirements as outlined by the World Health Organization and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention. This fee is nonrefundable.

Refunds & Cancellations: See the full policy on our website/in your email confirmation documents. Standard cancellation fees will not apply in 2021; Touchstone will offer a refund (less a reduced cancellation fee and the nonrefundable COVID-19 fee) up until the 24 hours prior to the start of your workshop, should you need to cancel. We ask that you cancel at least two weeks in advance of your workshop, as planning for your arrival on campus means ordering materials and/or food as well as additional

preparation expenses that we will then absorb due to each withdrawn registration. Late cancellation is being made available specifically for anyone who thinks they may have been exposed to the virus to cancel without the typical penalty.

Students who cancel a registration 30 or more days prior to the start of the workshop date will receive a full refund of their paid deposits less the nonrefundable COVID-19 fee. Students who cancel less than 30 days prior to the start of the workshop date will be assessed a cancellation fee based on the length of the workshop and Touchstone will retain the COVID-19 fee. If a workshop is cut short due to someone experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, the workshop will be prorated for a refund based on the days cancelled. Students who decline to abide by safety policies/procedures instituted may be asked to leave without refund of any monies, regardless of time remaining in their workshop. If Touchstone cancels a workshop, students will be able to transfer to another class (transfer fees will not apply in this instance) or receive a full refund.

Travel or Other Arrangements: Touchstone is not responsible for any nonrefundable deposits and/or fees paid towards travel or accommodations, including airplane/bus/train/other tickets, automobile rentals, baggage fees, hotel reservations, or contracts with rental services such as Airbnb, VRBO, etc. as well as any other related fees/expenses in relation to scheduled workshops, regardless of whether a workshop is held or cancelled.

Materials and Studio Fees

Materials and studio fees are charged to students based on studio usage and materials Touchstone is providing at the request of the instructor. Additionally, some instructors may require that you bring certain materials and tools with you, in which case a list will be provided. Final cost of these fees will be posted two weeks prior to the workshop to be paid in full at or before check-in. Touchstone is not responsible for any nonrefundable purchases of materials made for workshops, regardless of whether a workshop is held or cancelled. Touchstone will post all information regarding materials to help you prepare for your workshop(s); these may be found as a downloadable PDF under each respective workshop listing at touchstonecrafts.org.

Student Safety Guidelines and Procedures

While Touchstone encourages students and instructors to maximize their fun and camaraderie while on our beautiful campus, we have several student safety guidelines that must be understood and respected by all participants in order to maintain a secure and nurturing learning environment.

By enrolling in a workshop, students assume the risk of working with equipment and materials provided by Touchstone. The faculty, staff and organization are not responsible for injuries incurred as a result of improper or irresponsible use of tools, equipment, and/or facilities.

The use of alcohol in studio settings prohibited. No one is permitted to work within a studio at any time after consuming alcohol – this includes drinking before or during a workshop and also drinking at meal services and attempting to work in the studio thereafter. Responsible consumption of alcohol by students of legal drinking age is permitted on Touchstone's campus, however due to the increased potential for harm to all persons on campus, tools/equipment, facilities and property, we respectfully request that students keep alcohol out of the studios at all times.

The use and/or possession of illegal drugs will not be tolerated. Violation of this policy will force Touchstone to terminate the student agreement immediately without a refund and ask the individual(s) in question to vacate the campus immediately and permanently.

In the interest of safety, health, and the preservation of our campus, smoking is not permitted in any building. No one is permitted to burn candles, incense, or other flammables in any building.

Touchstone reserves the right to dismiss immediately and permanently any student – without refund – for behavior considered unacceptable, including but not limited to the list below. Additionally, law enforcement may be contacted.

- Any behavior which jeopardizes the safety of self or others
- Behavior which violates local, state, and/or federal laws
- Damage to, destruction, theft, or misuse of Touchstone property or the property of others
- Discriminatory conduct directed at a person based on race, national origin, color, creed, religion, sex, ages, disability, veteran status, sexual orientation, gender identity, or associational preference
- Disruption of the normal functioning of the Touchstone community, breaching the peace, disrupting the work of others, and/or violating the rights of others
- Hazing, physical abuse, physical violence, or threat of physical harm to others
- Hunting or any related activity is not permitted on Touchstone's campus
- Possession of a deadly weapon on Touchstone's premises
- Refusing to follow safety procedures for proper use of tools, equipment, and/or materials
- Refusing to participate in class if this adversely impacts the learning of others
- Sexual assault, abuse, harassment, or indecent exposure
- Unauthorized use of Touchstone's studios, housing and/or other property
- Use of alcohol or intoxication in the studios, underage drinking, and/or providing alcohol to anyone on campus under the age of 21
- Use, possession, or sale of illegal drugs or drug paraphernalia
- Verbal abuse or harassment of others

Emergency Procedures: In the event of any emergency, students should contact the nearest available staff member. In case of medical emergency or fire, contact 911. Basic first aid kits and fire extinguishers are located throughout campus; please be aware of their locations. In any situation, always get help first and do not put yourself in danger. Emergency procedures, phone numbers, and directions to Uniontown Hospital and MedExpress Urgent Care are located in each building. A phone is located in the dining hall for 24-hour emergency use.

Medical Conditions and Allergies: Students and instructors are asked to voluntarily provide a listing of any medical conditions or allergies that staff should be aware of in the event of an emergency. It is Touchstone's policy to contact 911 in the event of a medical emergency. Touchstone does not supply or administer any form of injectable adrenaline (epinephrine). If you have a known allergy to foods, insect stings/bites, environmental items, and/or other products, we strongly encourage you to bring your own supply of allergy medicines and/or EpiPen for self-injection. If you should have an accident that requires medical attention, call 911 and/or notify a staff member immediately. The Uniontown Hospital and MedExpress Urgent Care center are both about a 20-minute drive from Touchstone. If you have a nighttime emergency that cannot wait until morning, contact a designated staff member, call 911, and/or check the emergency phone list posted in each building.

Children on Campus

Youth Workshops (Ages 5-14) – Clay for Kids and Kids Summer Camp: Children who are taking a youth workshop at Touchstone must check in between 9:15 a.m. and 9:45 a.m. at the Gallery in Blaney Lodge before going to their studio. Children will be supervised by Touchstone staff/instructor during their regularly scheduled workshop. Parents/guardians are solely responsible for the supervision and safety outside of workshop times. Materials for all youth workshops are included in the cost of tuition. Students may get messy and be out on campus during their workshop – dress appropriately! Students must bring a bagged lunch; meals will not be available at the dining hall for these sessions. Children must be picked up by 2:30 p.m.

Teens in 1-Day Workshops (Ages 14-17): See Daily Workshop Schedules for info on check in/out and class times. Students will be supervised during regularly scheduled workshops. Students may only lodge on campus during their session with a parent/guardian who is also lodging on campus. Parents/guardians are solely responsible for the supervision and safety of their child(ren) outside of workshop times.

Teen Week Workshops (Ages 14-17): See Daily Workshop Schedules for info on check in/out and class times. Students will be supervised during the entirety of this session by instructors, staff and chaperones. Students lodging on campus are housed in single-sex dormitories/cabins. All students take a turn helping in the kitchen and keeping the campus clean. For more details on Teen Week, visit touchstonecrafts.org/teen-week.

Pets on Campus

Students/visitors are not permitted to bring pets or support/therapy/companion animals to Touchstone. The only exception is for a registered service animal. Visit www.ada.gov/regs2010/service_animal_qa.html to learn more about service animals.

Communication on Campus

Cell Service & Campus Wi-Fi: Touchstone's campus is in a rural area bordering a state forest, and cell service may be spotty at best. However, we do have Wi-Fi available on campus and the login information is provided at check-in. We recommend enabling your Wi-Fi calling so that you may use your phone to text and make phone calls (Settings -> Phone -> Wi-Fi Calling).

Touchstone Phones: You may have your party contact Touchstone's office (724-329-1370) during regular business hours to try to reach you and/or leave a message. The dining hall phone (724-329-9905) is available for use 24 hours daily but is not monitored by staff around-the-clock. If you are having difficulty connecting to Wi-Fi and need to make a call, we ask that you only make your calls on an as-needed basis and keep your calls as brief as possible. If it is necessary to make a long-distance call, please use a calling card or call collect. We appreciate your help in keeping rising utility costs at a minimum.

Messages: Phone and email messages are delivered to students during regular business hours or are otherwise posted to the message board near the phone in the dining hall. In an event of a message regarding an emergency, Touchstone staff will try to deliver the message as quickly as possible. Voicemails left during evening hours will be checked the following morning and messages delivered/posted thereafter.

Mail: Packages may be delivered to students at “Student Name”, c/o Touchstone Center for Crafts, 1049 Wharton Furnace Road, Farmington, PA 15437. Students should stop by the office daily if they are expecting mail; USPS deliveries are usually made between 10 a.m. and 11 a.m. and UPS/FedEx deliveries are usually made between 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. Students may arrange for pick-up of their ready-to-ship mail by UPS/FedEx at the office. The closest U.S. Post Office is about 4.5 miles from Touchstone and the closest UPS drop center is Staples in Uniontown, about 14 miles distance.

Lodging at Touchstone

Lodging on campus is the most convenient option for students participating in workshops. Residing onsite enables you to enjoy the camaraderie and artistic cross-pollination that occurs when students live, create, and break bread on campus. In order to keep lodging costs available to students at low rates, **Touchstone does not supply linens, pillows, towels, washcloths, toiletries, etc.** Please make sure to see the suggested packing list below to ensure you are prepared for your stay. Lodging space is limited, so please make reservations early to avoid disappointment. Linen packages are available for a \$50 rental charge that you may select during your workshop registration.

Lodging assignments are made on a first-come, first-served basis. We do our best to match students with the type of housing they request, but this is not always possible. Our staff will contact you should your preferred lodging of choice be unavailable. We cannot honor requests for specific rooms or buildings. Guests may not change rooms/cabins without approval from management.

For your protection and the safety of others, do not smoke or burn candles/incense/other flammables in any building. Fees will be imposed for any type of damage to facilities and/or furniture.

The water at Touchstone may at times be discolored due to high iron content, however it is safe. Our water is tested for contaminants on a regular basis as required by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental protection.

While at Touchstone, you may be sharing spaces you are accustomed to having to yourself. Keep in mind some people may be sleeping at irregular hours or may simply have trouble sleeping with too much noise. Please be considerate and help us preserve our community; keep restrooms and other common areas tidy after using them, wipe up your spills, place garbage in trash receptacles, return dirty dishes to the dining hall dish pit, and leave areas as you found them upon check-in. Ask a staff member if you need assistance. We appreciate your help in keeping our campus clean!

Required Items to Bring for Your Stay

- The materials, tools, and proper attire/gear as indicated on the materials list specific to your workshop

Required Items to Bring for Your Stay if You Did NOT Rent a Linen Package

- Bedding (single/twin-size sheets, blanket(s), sleeping bag, pillow(s), etc.)
- Towels, washcloths, foot/hand towels

Suggested Items to Bring for Your Stay

- Toiletries (shampoo, soap, etc.) and hair dryer
- Earplugs (if you are a light sleeper)
- Appropriate clothing for Touchstone’s wooded campus – comfortable walking shoes, warm clothes for evenings, etc.
- Flashlight for navigating campus in the evenings
- We provide a padlock if you are lodging in a cabin. However if you wish to bring your own combination/pad you may (cabins can be locked from the inside of the cabin, but do not place lock on outside of the cabin unless the staff and (if applicable) your roommate(s) can gain entry with a key or letter/number combination code)
- Insect repellent, allergy medication, and/or EpiPen for those who have sensitivities to insect stings, pollen, etc.
- Alarm clock, phone charger, camera, laptop computer or tablet (wireless connection available)
- Musical instrument(s), reading material, sketchbook, or portfolio of work to share
- Cash, Check, MasterCard, and/or Visa for materials/studio fees and/or purchases at the Bea Campbell Gallery Store

- Item(s) to donate to a summer Thursday evening auction (proceeds benefit scholarship funds for deserving students and/or operations for studio improvements)

For anything forgotten, there is a Dollar General located at 3701 National Pike, Farmington, PA 15437 as well as Walmart, Target, Walgreen's, etc. in the nearby city of Uniontown.

Meals at Touchstone

By purchasing a meal package from the Touchstone dining hall, you can focus on being creative and leave the meals to us! Touchstone understands that the value of a student's overall campus experience extends beyond the studio, and we assure our guests that the presentation and quality of the food and beverage service will be maintained at a high standard.

Touchstone asks that you indicate any food allergies and/or preferences during the registration process, so that we can do our best to meet your needs. We regret that we cannot accommodate kosher diets; however, vegetarian, vegan and gluten-free foods are available with advance notice.

The only way to guarantee meals will be available to you during your stay is to purchase a meal package in advance. Those who did not purchase a meal package at least one week in advance of their workshop session must wait until all other guests and staff members are served. Touchstone respectfully asks that guests not consume items from the salad bar and/or beverage station if you have not paid for a meal plan. Second helpings may be given AFTER all guests have passed through the line.

For those students not purchasing a meal plan, please know that Touchstone has very limited food preparation facilities available to guests. There is a microwave, refrigerator, toaster, and hot water dispenser in the dining hall for guests' convenience, but any type of substantive cooking (except over a campfire) will not be possible. Those who intend to cook must bring their own cookware and supplies.

Lunch Only Meal Plans begin with lunch on the first day of your workshop and end with lunch on the last day of your workshop.

Full Meal Plans begin with breakfast on the first day of your workshop and include three meals a day through lunch on the last day of your workshop. Dinner the night prior to your workshop is an 'add-on' item that must be purchased separately at registration or prior to arrival.

Meals are not available for youth workshops. Symposium meal plans can be found on our website.

Getting to Touchstone

Directions: Touchstone's campus is located at 1049 Wharton Furnace Road, Farmington, PA 15437. Please **DO NOT follow GPS** or online directions leading to Touchstone via Scott Run Road as this road is in a state of severe disrepair. Please refer to provided directions when traveling to campus.

From the Pennsylvania Turnpike

Exit the Pennsylvania Turnpike at Exit 75. Take the exit ramp to Route 119 South toward Connellsville. Follow Route 119 South to Uniontown. Stay on Route 119 South to Route 40 East. Do not take any exits off of Route 40. Follow Route 40 to the top of the mountain. The Summit Inn Resort will be at the top of the mountain on the right-hand side. Continue on Route 40 East for another ½ mile, then make a right turn onto Wharton Furnace Road. Travel on Wharton Furnace Road for 5 miles. You will see a small white church on your left. Turn right into Touchstone's entrance, about 100 yards past the church.

From Washington, DC

Take I-495 (D.C. Beltway) to I-270 northwest to I-68 West at Hancock, Maryland. Follow I-68 West to the Uniontown/Route 40 exit. Take Route 40 West to Farmington, Pennsylvania. Stay on Route 40 West approximately 5½

miles. When you see a sign that reads “Dangerous Mountain Ahead,” get into the left lane. About ½ mile after you pass the sign, make a left turn from Route 40 onto Wharton Furnace Road. Travel on Wharton Furnace Road for 5 miles. You will see a small white church on your left. Turn right into Touchstone’s entrance, about 100 yards past the church.

From Baltimore, Maryland

Take I-70 East and exit the I-68 West/US 40 West exit. Take the US 40 West exit, Exit 14B, toward Uniontown. Stay on Route 40 West for approximately 20 miles. When you see a sign that reads “Dangerous Mountain Ahead,” get into the left lane. About ½ mile after you pass the sign, make a left turn from Route 40 onto Wharton Furnace Road. Travel on Wharton Furnace Road for 5 miles. You will see a small white church on your left. Turn right into Touchstone’s entrance, about 100 yards past the church.

From Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania (Airport)

Take route 60 East to I-79 South to Washington, Pennsylvania. Take I-70 East and exit at the Route 51 South exit. As you approach Uniontown, you will see Fayette Plaza and Giant Eagle. About ½ mile past the plaza, bear right onto the Route 119 South/Route 40 East exit. Take Route 119 South to Route 40 East (do not get off on the Route 40 Main Street exit). Follow Route 40 to the top of the mountain. The Summit Inn Resort will be at the top of the mountain on the right. Continue on Route 40 East for another ½ mile, then make a right turn onto Wharton Furnace Road. Travel on Wharton Furnace Road for 5 miles. You will see a small white church on your left. Turn right into Touchstone’s entrance, about 100 yards past the church.

From Morgantown, West Virginia

Take I-69 East out of the Morgantown area. After 2.7 miles, take exit 10 toward WV 857/Cheat Lake/Fairchance Road. Turn left onto WV 43 North and continue 2.7 miles to PA 43 North. Follow PA 43 North (partial toll road) for 11.8 miles and exit onto US 40 East toward Hopwood, Pennsylvania. Drive up the mountain, approximately 6 miles, and note the Summit Inn Resort at the top of the mountain on the right side. Travel another ½ mile, then turn right onto Wharton Furnace Road. Follow Wharton Furnace Road for 5 miles. You will see a small white church on your left. Turn right into Touchstone’s entrance, about 100 yards past the church.

Transportation Services: Students are responsible for their own travel arrangements. Touchstone does not currently provide transportation services and is not able to make travel arrangements for students. Furthermore, Touchstone is not responsible for any nonrefundable deposits and/or fees paid towards travel or accommodations, including airline/bus/train or other tickets, automobile rentals, baggage fees, hotel reservations, or contracts with rental services such as Airbnb, VRBO, etc. as well as any other related fees/expenses in relation to scheduled workshops, regardless of whether a workshop is held or cancelled.

Airport: Pittsburgh International Airport (PIT) is the closest major airport and is approximately 89 miles (about a 2-hour drive) from Touchstone. Visit flypittsburgh.com for more information.

Car Rental, Taxi, and Shuttle Services: Touchstone is in a rural area and public transportation is very limited. FACT runs to/from specific areas of Pittsburgh to Uniontown, then Uniontown/Nemacolin. The closest drop off is at Chalk Hill (Subway) about 4.5 miles from Touchstone (check with FACT to make certain this is still a drop off or if there is another, better drop off). This service does not run directly to Touchstone’s campus. We do not advise walking to our campus for safety reasons.
