- 7) Rubber Cement pick up (for masking fluid removal) https://www.dickblick.com/search/?q=rubber%20cement%20pick%20up
- 8) Gaterboard or Foamcore to tape your watercolor paper to
- 9) Brush For Masking Fluid
- 10) Masking tape to tape paper to backing board
- 11) Water container, any type, I use a cottage cheese tub
- 12) Roll paper towels/old towel

### \*Notes\*

### Paper

Feel free to use whatever brand of good quality paper that you are comfortable with on which to transfer your reference drawings. The Arches pad or sheets of scrap paper are used to practice techniques and various color combinations. I recommend either Arches, Fabriano, or Saunders Waterford. *I use Arches 300 lb.* 

Size doesn't matter, but no smaller than 8x10".

# Paint

*I prefer Daniel Smith or Winsor & Newton.* The colors that I have listed below always live on my palette and are standard for most of my painting subjects. I will not be using them all. I put a star next to the ones that I will be using the most for this workshop. Feel free to use your own palette. Do not feel compelled to buy all of these.

*Alizarin Crimson	Scarlet
*Quinacridone gold	Winsor Yellow
Hookers Green	Antwerp Blue
*Peacock Blue	*Indigo
*Mineral Violet	*Indanthrone
*Burnt Umber	Cerulean Blue
*Yellow ochre	Opera Pink
Quinacridone Coral	Green Gold

Vermillion Aureolin \*Ultramarine Blue Winsor Blue Burnt Sienna \*Cobalt Blue Quinacridone Violet Permanent Orange

# Brushes

Various sizes (again, whatever you are comfortable with). I typically use a 1" flat or larger for backgrounds, as well as #6 or 8, 10 or 12, or 14 rounds. *I prefer Ascota Perla, Loew Cornell Ultra Round, and Princeton Aqua Elite.* Rigger or fine pointed brush for details and a grainer (sometimes called a comb) brush.
